Our House guests, Mike and Debra Blayne were very kind to share some facets of their lives with me. Mike was happy to report that he finished the chemotherapy treatments and has only one treatment of radiation left before he and Debra head home to Omak for good. They have spent the past six weeks at Our House and have their sights set on a future of travel, which they both love, in an RV big enough to hold them and their two best buddy labradoodles, Bailey and Babe.

The Blaynes have a history of travel – Debra was born into a military family which allowed her to travel the world as a child. For a job as a T.V. technician with Worldwide Productions who had teamed up with Amway, Mike was able to travel all over the U.S. Each year Amway held “Dream Nights” across the country, doing 27 shows in 31 days. Mike was in charge of the set-up and running of all technology used in these shows. He did this for six years. Afterwards, he was an inspector for the fiber optics line that ran from Olympia to Everett six days a week, 12 hours a day. Whew!

Debra and Mike’s blended family consists of five children, 12 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. Debra works for the Bridgeport School District doing their accounts payable and purchasing. She is looking forward to retiring as soon as reasonably possible after they return to Omak. When Mike was diagnosed with cancer, his Omak doctor told him he needed to see a specialist so they chose Wenatchee doctors for his care and treatments. Debra’s supervisor told her about the Our House home-away-from-home.

Once comfortable at Our House, the Blaynes began to realize just how important this place was to them. They

have enjoyed getting to know the other guests but mostly they were enamored of the people associated with Our House. They agreed that Becky and Greg (day & night managers) were stands-outs, but they feel the same way about all the volunteers who’ve been here for them during their stay. Debra said it really feels like home and that if they lived in Wenatchee, she would be right here volunteering. She said she is going to look at volunteer opportunities in Omak when they get settled in their own home again. I don’t think there’s any nicer compliment than that!

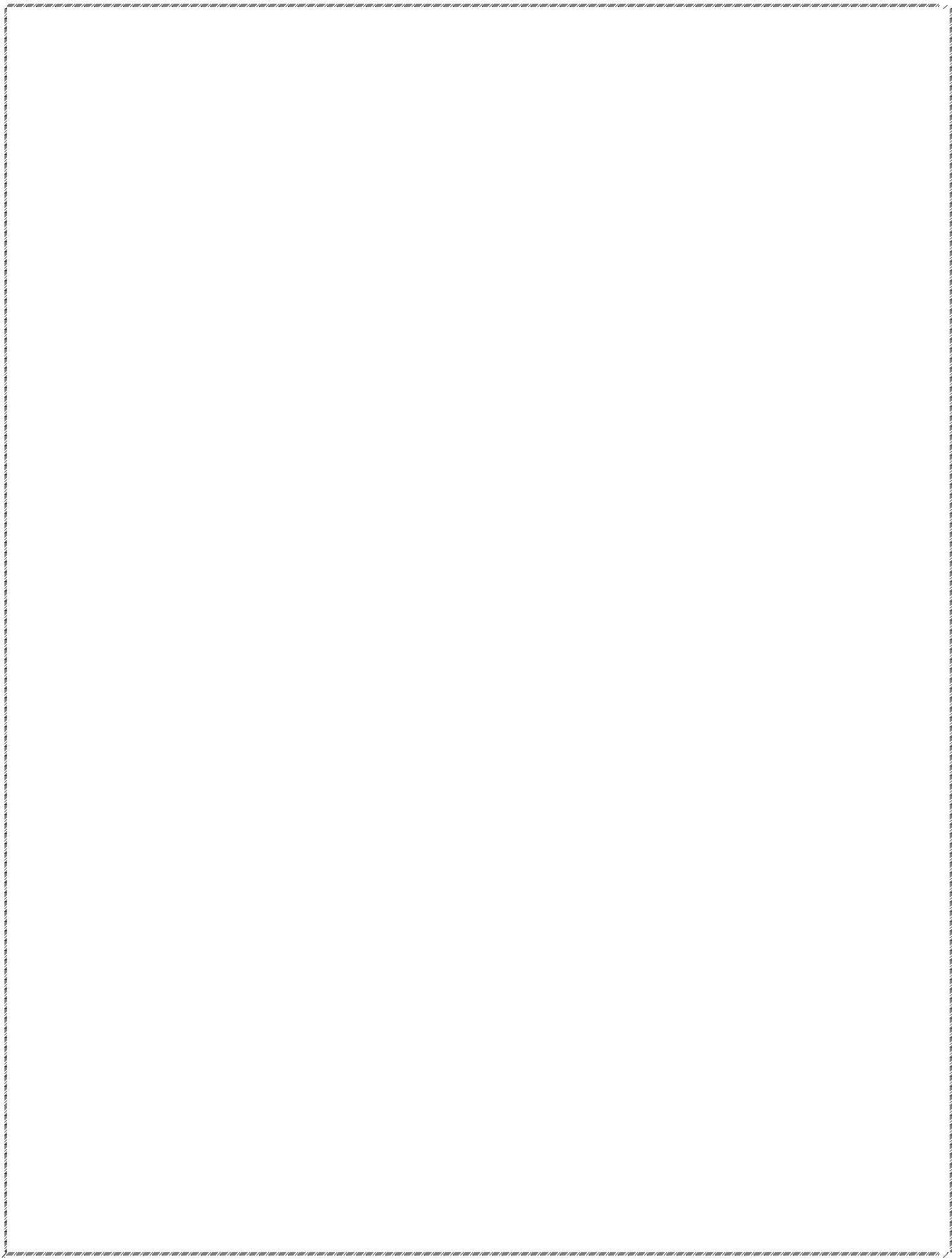
